Our first order of business was to reward a season long competition by our members to get onto their respective All Star Teams. All Star Team members were awarded \$200 each and Team Captains received \$250 for a total of \$2,100 for the All Star Teams. All dollar values awarded are scholarships and are deposited into individual accounts in the USBC SMART Program where recipients have 8 years following high school graduation to use their funds. No other program offers this much eligibility time.

In the unlimited “Classic” division (200 & up):

Donovan Grubaugh earned the top qualifying spot with 1332. In the first stepladder match #5 Tanner Acosta of Lebanon defeated #4 Kerissa Andersen of Vancouver 171-127 where scores became difficult. Then #3 Brian DeLuisa-Anderson of Gladstone defeated Acosta 226-158 in match #2, then defeated #2 Hunter Bower of Vancouver 236-158 in the 3rd match, and in the Championship match, he had a tougher go against Donovan Grubaugh of Salem finally getting the nod for the title 203-186 adding a star to his banner. The cut was 1206.
